For about the last 10 years, I have co-owned and operated ex-French Army Piper L18C Cub G-AYPS - a standard LAA vintage type - which is based in the hangar at Inverness. I think it's fair to say vintage machines are my main interest, but building something is definitely on my bucket list. As far as this year is concerned, we already have our two fly-ins more or less confirmed, those being Sollas on Saturday 24th & Sunday 25th June and our annual fly-in at Easter Airfield on Saturday 29th & Sunday 30th July. All being well with the old weather thing, I have no doubt these will be excellent events and we look forward to seeing you at both. In addition, I've been thinking there might perhaps be scope for the Strut to organise some other stuff this year. Easter Airfield News

Due to weather it's been quite quiet at Easter. We have had occasional visits from the Easterton Squadron and Highland Aviation's gyrocopters have been dropping in. We have managed to fly G-AVSA most weeks.

We had an issue with our Sky echo:-

We have had a Sky Echo for a couple of years now and kept it in the plane plugged in & powered whilst flying, but last week it would not turn on!

I contacted UAvionics and their helpline called me the following day. The first question was: "Do you keep it in the aircraft and plugged in?" My reply was yes.

"That's the problem. The aircraft doesn't supply enough power to keep the battery charged up. It uses more power than it can accept whilst flying."

Apparently this is clearly stated on page 18 of the manual that it should be taken home at least once a month and fully charged for at least 12 hours. I've done this and it's fixed it.

I happened to mention that to Aitken Paton and his has done the same, so perhaps others may have the same problem . Simply take it home, put it on a proper charger for a minimum of 12 hours once a month.
